Top Tips


- Plan your meals and make a shopping list so that you buy only what will be eaten.
- Deal with any leftovers you still have by investing in a suitable compost bin, if you have the space (No methane produced this way).
- If you have a garden, grow some of your own vegetables and pick what you need as you need it.
- Buy the 'wonky' fruit and veg which would otherwise be wasted. It's often cheaper too.
- If you have a smartphone, then download the 'OLIO' app and offer the food you are not going to eat in time to other people (I once over-catered for a family gathering and was able to pass on a large tray of sandwiches and snacks this way).



By trying to reduce our food waste we can help to keep global warming as low as possible, save money, save water and almost certainly feed more people – as long as we remember to share.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if, by small changes to our habits, we could point the way to a well-fed, sustainable world –pointing the way to God's kingdom where all life flourishes.

What do we do with the leftovers?

"After everyone had eaten all they wanted, Jesus' disciples picked up twelve large baskets of leftovers." Matthew 14:20

The Feeding of the 5000 is the only one of Jesus' miracles to be recorded in all four gospels, so it must be an important one. It speaks of God's generosity and God's ability to supply abundantly all that we need. But have you ever wondered what happened to those 12 baskets of leftovers? Did they feed them to the birds? Or perhaps take them to the next village and share them out there?

One thing I am pretty certain of is that they will not have simply been 'thrown out'. (Where is 'out', by the way?) Wasting food was definitely not the done thing back then: "Even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the children's' table." Mark 7:28

Food waste today is a very different story. Some of it is wasted on farms, some in the production process, and some within our homes as we forget what is in the fridge or scrape leftovers into the bin.

Here are a few random facts about food waste for you, some of which really 'boggled' my mind:

30%-50% of food produced for human consumption is wasted annually

The average family in Great Britain wastes nearly £60 a month by throwing away food, in some cases almost an entire meal a day

Food waste that goes to landfill produces <u>methane</u>, a global warming gas much more harmful than carbon dioxide

Food waste is responsible for 8% of global warming gases, about twice that of the aviation industry

Food waste is responsible for over 170 trillion litres of water annually



We are all called by God: Thinking About Vocation

At the beginning of this month of June the UK and Commonwealth celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen. On the death of her father on 6th February 1952 Queen Elizabeth II acceded to the throne at the age of



25, and her coronation was on 2 June 1953. The Queen did not choose her vocation, which was literally an accident of birth, but she actively chose to embrace it, and dedicated her life to fulfilling her vocation as monarch strengthened by her faith in Christ. During the coronation service the Queen was anointed with oil by the Archbishop of Canterbury as a powerful symbol of the Holy Spirit giving her the grace to fulfil her calling, her vocation.

Towards the end of this month, at 3pm on June 25th, our curates Revd. Josh Peckett and Revd. Jo Glenwright will be ordained priests by the Bishop of Leeds in Leeds Minster. They will also be anointed with oil and prayed over that they will receive God's grace to fulfil his vocation as priests in the Church of England. Priestly vocation is not an accident of birth but is discerned over months or even years.

Over my lifetime, longer than Jo's and Josh's but shorter than the Queen's, I have been called by God to be a medical doctor, a wife and mother, a licensed lay minister, a deacon and now a priest. Our vocation at different times in our life may change!

As Christians, as baptised followers of Christ, we are all called by God to serve him, whether that is within our families, in secular work or within the church.

We are all unique, we all have gifts from God, and we are all needed in the life and work of the Church so that the Church's vocation may be fulfilled, and all hear the good news of abundant life in Jesus Christ.

Take some time this month to ask God in prayer to show you what your calling is at this time in this place. Take a look at the information on the Diocesan website about vocations:

And please do talk with any of the clergy if you hear God calling you to any role within the church.

Lord, help us to believe that we are all ordinary people made extraordinary through your vision and your power.

Take our insecurities and feelings of inadequacy, and give us the courage to see ourselves and others as you see us, with gifts and potential to transform your world and build your Kingdom.

Let it Blow!

Did you watch the television series, A House in Time? Narrated by David Olusoga, it told the story of one house in Headingley, over two hundred years. It revealed the values of bygone ages, how Leeds became a city, how society changed.

My favourite inhabitants were a Quaker family who stood up against war. A Madeleine Bunting book, The Plot, does the same thing for a smallholding near the White Horse of Kilburn, by the North York Moors. She explores the landscape, farming, climate change, spirituality of that obscure acre.

In a frantically-moving world, it is good to appreciate Place; to stop, be still, and recognise the uniqueness and wonder of this particular spot. This can be small – a metre of garden teaming with millions of invisible life-forms, with blades of grass like no others in the universe – or one's home, or the greater Headingley of our churches.

(Check out Far Headingley by David Hall, and Headingley by Eveleigh Bradford.) I loved it recently when our churches combined for daily online reflection about Headingley; I learned so much about where we live, our communities, our neighbours.

We're lucky; I love saying where I'm from. But some people feel trapped in unhappy places. When I left a challenging urban parish after 10 years as vicar, one of my congregation said, "I wish I could move"; her circumstances and dependencies made that impossible. I was privileged, I could leave.

Diary of a church Dog

May is Mental Health Awareness Month in the USA (October in the UK) but I would say that every month and day should be designated to Mental Health Awareness. In the UK 9th to 15th May was Mental Health Awareness week and the theme this year was loneliness. Covid has driven a great number of people to higher levels of distress resulting from people's sense of isolation.

My mumma got me because she lost her most beloved husband as a result of mental health issues which ultimately led to him taking his own life. She says that even though I am a naughty pup who has a will of his own she loves me for the love that I bring her and for the fact that I am always there keeping her company. There are days when mumma, like many people, can go all day and not see another person to talk to so she talks to me. Sometimes we sing together, well once she starts to sing, I just join in. I know that mumma is grateful for my company and she says she doesn't know what she would do without me. Mumma is lucky to have me but not all people are so lucky.

In England (2020) 4912 deaths were suicide with the male rate being almost three times that of women, men aged 45-49 having the highest rate. Thankfully we are now engaging more in a dialogue about mental health and there are groups like CALM, www.thcalmzone.net call 0800585858 The Samaritans call 116 123 jo@samaritans.org SHOUT 85258. These services are for anyone who's struggling. They wont judge. They are free, anonymous and always open.

We all need to take care of our mental health and be aware of each other's too. My big brother made a film https://vimeo.com/313146022 about mental health feel free to watch it. Let's hope that the dialogue that has begun continues and we all learn to ask "How are you?" with meaning and the skills to back it up.

Some of us, for job reasons especially, move a lot. When you move, try to appreciate the places you leave and go to. Many people are forced to move against their will. We see in Ukraine, as previously in Syria, how the horrors of war tear people from places they love. People who are homeless, place-less, forced to be migrant people, refugees, deserve the greatest compassion of our communities and our State.

Having said that, I'm surprisingly uninterested in going to the Holy Land. People who go are energised by it, but the magnetism doesn't attract me. It's partly politics - Israeli Governments are not always the best representatives of compassionate Jewish people — and it's partly Pentecost.

Incarnation – Jesus in a particular time and place in the human story – was wonderful; his teaching and example are for all people for ever. But Easter and Pentecost show the risen Christ bursting out of the constraints of time of place. "Christ is risen!" is true for all places and all times. The Holy Spirit, the breath of God, gives life to us all, wherever we are. We don't need to be in a particular place to be enlivened by the Spirit of God. The wind of the Holy Spirit blows through all our lives, our churches, our communities, our places.

Let's each of us appreciate the place where we are. Let's pray for and support people who are trapped, and people who are homeless, place-less.

And enjoy the freedom of the Holy Spirit, letting God's breath fill you with life, wherever you are.





St Chads Lunch Club Lives Again

The St Chads Lunch Club has been going for many years (since at least the 1990s!) but it had to stop in 2020 due to the pandemic. Now it is back!

What is it? It is a weekly hot lunch event for local senior citizens held in St Chads Parish Centre Small Hall on Wednesdays starting at 12.00 noon. We actually revived last December with an excellent Christmas Lunch attended by some of the bravest of our previous regular attenders (see the photographs).



At the time, it was expected to continue in the New Year with a full programme for anyone who might be interested.
